





- 12. All meetings will be held at a time and in a location that is reasonable, convenient and practical considering the situation of all Partners.

Admitting a New Partner

13. No new Partners may be admitted into the Partnership.

Voluntary Withdrawal of a Partner






We are now into week 5 and the job is not complete.

There is also the circumstance of the organisation keeps a "safe space", however when Paul was asked for the keys back previously because the work was not going to the pace as promised, And when asked not to "rip" and more stuff off the pub building, Paul reacted with "he's a hot head" and hung up on a trustee because - Quote: "Me and Andy are from the schemes" meaning Paul and Andy, Andy in definition is a trustee with Eat Up. Indicating from Paul that a type of "threat"

was taken on board by the recipient. This was reported to People Hub the instant it occurred. A report will be drawn up. With no contract and maladaptive behaviour from Paul, the HR department suggest a letter to terminate all future works with Paul. And a request for the keys to be returned within 14 Days. (its strongly recommended thai happens asap)
